Establishment of Climate Change Cell (July 2017)

Dr. Sadaf on the valuable guidance provided by worthy Vice Chancellor, Prof. Dr. Razia Sultana took the initiative to establish Climate Change Cell (CCC) at SBBWU Peshawar in 2017. The agenda of establishment of Climate Change Cell was prepared by Dr. Sadaf Bashir and presented in Academic Council in May 2017 and before Syndicate in July 2017. The Syndicate approved the establishment of CCC.

Mission Statement

The Climate Change Cell will support the people, communities and institutions of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa as well as Pakistan as it will address the impact of climate change through research, awareness enhancing and capacity building. It will foster dialogue and facilitate platform in which government departments, the private sector, educational institutions, research organizations and civil society can work together to develop local, national and regional programmes to combat adverse climate change effects and create opportunities for sustainable development.

Area of Interest/Research

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

World Wide Fund for Nature-Pakistan

And

Climate Change Cell, Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Women University, Peshawar

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the World Wide Fund for Nature-Pakistan, Ferozepur Road, Lahore (Hereinafter referred to as "WWF-Pakistan") and Climate Change Cell, Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Women University, Peshawar (Hereinafter referred to as "CCC-SBBWUP") sets forth the terms and conditions for collaboration in mutually agreed areas of cooperation between the two institutions.

PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS

World Wide Fund for Nature-Pakistan (WWF-Pakistan) is the largest conservation organization in Pakistan. It has been working since 1970 with important partners such as communities, government, civil society, international organizations, industries, and corporate entities, towards the conservation of environment and improving the management of country's natural resources. WWF-Pakistan is a part of the global WWF Network, which has an active presence in over a 100 countries. WWF-Pakistan has a presence in all the provincial capitals, as well as considerable outreach in targeted field sites, protected areas, and other key ecological sites. The organization has over 300 employees from the diverse backgrounds including biologists, ecologist, foresters, freshwater experts, agriculturists, sociologists, environmental economists, engineers, GIS experts, etc.

Climate Change Cell, Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Women University, Peshawar

Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Women University Peshawar is a premier women university of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Its academic programmes are designed to meet the national needs and challenges of the new millennium. Traditional fields of Social, Biological and Physical Sciences have been updated with emerging trends and new disciplines are being introduced to prepare professionals to manage the ever-growing demands of knowledge economy with requisite degree of expertise.

The university has recently undertaken an initiative to address the climate change issue through establishing a Climate Change Cell (CCC) for facilitating scholarly research/education and industrial services. This Centre will contribute, in particular, in creating awareness about the severity of climate change issue in Pakistan, and facilitate research to support informed policymaking and thus support the efforts of climate change adaptation and mitigation for the citizens as per National Climate Change Policy of Pakistan.

The Mission of Climate Change Cell is to support the people, communities and institutions of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa as well as Pakistan as it will address the impact of climate change through research.

Purpose of the collaboration

The purpose of this MOU is to create and maintain an amicable working relationship between WWF-Pakistan and CCC-SBBWUP. This MOU assures cooperation of both parties for sharing of information and opportunities to allow them to contribute to each other's' initiatives and work to contribute towards the mutual goal of environmental protection. Moreover, the MOU will enable WWF-Pakistan and CCC-SBBWUP to take a lead in issues pertaining to expertise in their respective niches. Further, the purpose of the MOU is to synergize energies and prevent the duplication of efforts.

AREAS OF COLLABORATION

In order to establish a cooperative relationship through mutual assistance in the areas of research and education, WWF-Pakistan and CCC-SBBWUP agree to undertake the following mutually beneficial collaborative initiatives.

Role of WWF-Pakistan

WWF-Pakistan within its territorial jurisdiction, agrees to:

- Collaborate with CCC-SBBWUP on conducting ecological baseline assessments and research studies to further build knowledge of natural resource conservation and management
- Extend opportunities of collaboration in issues related to environmental protection and natural resource management especially pertaining to wildlife, forests, freshwater, climate and energy and food and oceans
- Jointly initiate policy level advocacy, field interventions and explore possibility to develop and conduct studies conducted for ensuring environmental conservation with the cooperation of CCC-SBBWUP
- Extend its GIS Lab facilities for mapping of fieldwork and analysis on the areas of mutual research.
- Offer training workshops for capacity building of CCC-SBBWUP faculty, researchers, and students of Environmental and Biological Sciences.
- 6. Provide internship opportunities to the students of CCC-SBBWUP who wish to conduct research on a relevant topic on the Western Himalaya eco-region and its associated natural resources. Further, offer Eco-internship Programme for the students of CCC-SBBWUP through our YDP (Youth Development Programme) Team.
- Provide CCC-SBBWUP access to its resource materials (current and previous publications) for factual and authentic information and also to the image bank i.e. photographs, movies, images and maps etc.
- Provide support to visiting faculty to WWF Pakistan's programme sites for research and/or teaching purposes.
- Engage Ph. D scholars in WWF-Pakistan's long term programmes for scientific data collection and analysis on different aspects of the programmes
- Involve CCC-SBBWUP students in environmental activities (especially related to waste cleanup drives, plantarion, awareness raising etc.)

- 11. Participate actively in media house programmes related to environmental awareness
- Collaborate in the field of maritime policy research including in fisheries and conservation of marine animals
- 13. Devise draft policies for conservation and exploitation of marine resources for consideration of the government
- Suggest Government to undertake steps necessary for conservation and protection of marine habitat and improve livelihood of coastal communities.

Role of the Climate Change Cell, Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Women University, Peshawar

CCC-SBBWUP, within its territorial jurisdiction agrees to:

- Collaborate with WWF-Pakistan to leverage support from across different academic departments and research centers of CCC-SBBWUP in research projects of mutual interest including environment, wildlife, forestry, food and agriculture, climate change (adaptation & mitigation), freshwater sustainability and other prograjmmes.
- Incorporate research topics about the issues related to forest, wildlife & pasture / rangelands resources, climate change and food security in their research plans;
- Provide the WWF Pakistan access to its resource material both print and electronic including but not limited to the scientific journals, research papers etc.;
- Offer training workshops for the capacity-building of WWF-Pakistan staff on mutually agreed thematic areas.
- Develop joint research projects in collaboration with WWF-Pakistan and with participation of selected researchers from both institutions.
- Collaborate on upcoming research, joint policy papers for dissemination to environment planners and policy makers, conferences and visits for field studies, among others
- 7. Facilitate WWF-Pakistan's Communications, Corporate Partnership and Fundraising Departments for developing communication material, environment education initiatives and for fundraising activities through student's engagement programme i.e. Eco-internship Programme. In this case, CCC-SBBWUP will register a minimum of 100 students per annum for Eco-Internship Programme.
- 8. Provide support on other relevant research agenda of mutual interest to both parties.

WWF-Pakistan and CCC-SBBWUP agree to:

- Nominate 'focal persons' for regular interactions concerning the implementation of this MOU;
- Facilitate each other in engaging local and foreign universities for long-term collaboration that benefit students and faculty;
- Further develop terms of partnership for specific activities that involve financial implications and specific responsibilities;
- Collaborate in research and information sharing regarding conservation and natural resource management subjects especially those about environmental protection, forests and wildlife management and development of agricultural resources.



Under this agreement various Faculties, Departments, Centers and Units of partner institutions will be able to collaborate in areas that will be of mutual benefit.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

There will be no financial obligations between the two parties under this MOU. This Memorandum of Understanding is based on mutual consent and agreement of cooperation. However in future, if any research or project opportunities may arise, WWF-Pakistan and CCC-SBBWUP can mutually deliver the services bearing any necessary financial obligations attached to it, partner for projects or jointly submit the proposals to the national and international donors.

DURATION, VALIDITY AND AMENDMENT OF MOU

- a) This MOU shall become effective on the date that it is signed by both parties and shall be valid until 31st December 2022. However, this duration may be amended by mutual consent of both the Parties in writing and is extendable, based on successful completion and achievement of targets.
- b) This MOU may not be modified, amended, altered or supplemented, except upon the execution and delivery of a written consent of both the parties hereto.
- c) This MOU may be terminated by either party at any time provided that the party who wishes to terminate gives written notice of its intention at least three months prior to termination.
- d) Nothing in the above MOU shall be construed as legally binding.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Both parties agree to maintain in confidence and not disclose, reproduce, copy any materials, documentation or specification which are provided by one partner to the other partner under this MOU with the request to maintain confidentiality.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS, RESULTS AND PUBLICATIONS

All intellectual property brought by each party to the relationship under this MOU remains in the ownership of that party. The reproduction of reports would require prior permission of both parties.

Qualification for authorship or inventor-ship shall be in keeping with generally accepted criteria. The order of authorship / inventor-ship shall be a joint decision of the co-authors or co-inventors in any coauthored publication or co-invented invention. Each author or inventor, as the case maybe, shall have participated sufficiently in the work to take public responsibility for the content or invention.

For the purpose of this MOU, "Intellectual Property" means all rights in relation to inventions (including patents), registered and unregistered trademarks (including service marks), copyright, circuit layouts, registrable designs, registrable plant varieties, processes, know-how and confidential information in the industrial, scientific and artistic fields including application or right to apply for registration of any of those rights.

ADVERTISEMENT

Neither party shall use directly or by implication the names or trademark or any other identity of the other party, nor any of the other party's affiliates or contractors, nor any abbreviations thereof, or of any staff member, faculty member, student, or employee of the other party in connection with any products, publicity, promotion, financing, advertising, or other public disclosure without the prior written permission of the other party.

RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

1. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed by the Parties or any third Person as creating the relationship of principal and agent, partnership or joint venture between the Parties, it



being understood and agreed that no provision contained herein, and no act of the Parties, shall be deemed to create any relationship between the Parties other than the relationship set forth herein.

No Party shall incur any debts or make any commitments for the other, except to the extent, if at all, specifically provided herein.

SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES AND ARBITRATION

- The Parties shall use their best efforts to settle amicably any dispute, controversy or claim arising
 out of this MOU or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof. Where the parties wish to seek
 such an amicable settlement through conciliation, the conciliation shall take place at the level of
 the Director General WWF-Pakistan and Vice Chancellor SBBWUP or their nominees within a
 time frame of three (3) months after the dispute or controversy arises or such extended date as the
 parties may mutually agree to in writing.
- 2. Any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this MOU, or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof, which has not been successfully resolved by conciliation in accordance with Clause 9.1, shall be settled by arbitration in accordance with the Pakistan Arbitration Act, 1940, subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of Lahore and Peshawar. The arbitration shall be conducted by three (3) arbitrators whose award shall be by majority and the Parties agree to be finally bound by such award.
